The port of Le Pouliguen, which owes its development to salt transport, is now a marina where you can admire a large number of boats. You will then follow the road to the Pointe de Penchâteau and ride along the wild coastline and cliffs. We recommend taking a detour into the small sandy coves. From the Baie du Scall, the path will lead you to the town of Batz-sur-Mer, a charming 'Petite Cité de Caractère' located between the sea and the salt marshes. You will then continue along the invigorating wild coastline to the charming port of Le Croisic.

TO SEE ON THE WAY...

• Brécéan Town Hall

17 rue Jules Benoît - Le Pouliguen

Representative of 19th century seaside architecture, this chalet is ressembles a small Louis XIII-style château, with a central building, flanked by two wings. The roof has a steep pitch and is decorated with beautiful finials. On the facades, there are sculpted cartouches featuring the Pellan family coat of arms. Since 1984, the property has been home to the town hall of Le Pouliguen.

A museum with a salty taste! A clever blend of the past and present, the museum tour takes you to the heart of a 19th-century 'salorge' (salt warehouse). Collector's items, artistic works and new technologies interact in an area of almost 850 m². Visitors learn about the history of Guérande salt, and step by step, discover the people of the marsh. This exhibition space is a moving place that will arouse curiosity.

• The church of Saint-Guénolé

The church of Saint-Guénolé, in the Gothic style of Brittany, is full of architectural and religious treasures. From the top of its tower, 70 m above sea level, discover an exceptional panoramic view over the Guérande peninsula and the salt marshes!

FIND OUT MORE...

• The wild coast

A protected site, the Grande Côte, also known as the 'wild coast', is a succession of granite cliffs and rocky clusters, dotted with creeks that are swept by the waves of the Atlantic. Between the Pointe de Penchâteau and the Baie du Scall, there are no less than 23 caves, accessible at low tide. From the coast, you can observe a host of seabirds such as brent geese, sandwich terns and penguins that have come to spend the winter here.

This is a fragile environment, so please help us to preserve it by staying on the cycle path only. The coastal path can be explored on foot at bicycle stops.
